The Safe Worker

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Who is the course intended to help.

The "Safe Worker" is designed for workers, volunteers, employees, full and part time staff who have no supervisory or management responsibility.

Aims:

The course aims to provide learners with an understanding of their legal duties, and the need to co-operate to effectively implement the health and safety arrangements within the company.

Content:

- The health and safety responsibilities of the company;
- The health and safety management system;
- Assessing risks;
- Controlling risks;
- Identifying hazards (covers a range of typical hazards);
- Investigating accidents;
- Measuring performance;
- Protecting the environment;

Intended Learning outcome:

On successful completion of the course, delegates will be able to demonstrate their understanding of:

- employers and employees legal duties;
- the need for effective safety management system within the company;
- risk assessment and appropriate risk control measures;
- workplace hazards;
- the benefits of active and reactive monitoring for continued improvements in health and safety performance;
- reducing environmental impacts;

	• Demonstrate personal behaviour in the working environment that protects the health and safety of themselves and others, and is in accordance with instructions.

Outline of Unit Content

This course is for everyone at work including those who are entering the workplace for the first time and those that have had no formal Health and Safety training (Whether voluntary, paid, full or part-time).

This course is about the health and safety responsibilities of people in a workplace.

It deals with the knowledge required to make sure that:

- Workers actions or omissions do not create health and safety hazards;
- Workers identify significant risks in the workplace, and
- take sensible action to put things right, including: reporting situations which pose a danger to themselves and others in the workplace and seeking advice.

The aim is for them to demonstrate an awareness of significant health and safety risks in the working environment and being aware of how to identify and deal with them appropriately.

Learning Outcomes and Assessment Criteria

Outline of Proposed Learning Activities/Approach to Delivery

The programme is delivered on line and is available 24/7 from anywhere that has an internet connection. The e learning course will be provided through a Managed Learning Environment (MLE) and consists of interactive modules containing the underpinning knowledge for the programme and activities for learners to apply their knowledge and practice their skills. Learner progress can be monitored by employers and support can be provided where necessary.
